PRELIMS-DAY ELIMINATION CHECKLIST (MEMORISE)

Before marking **ANY option**, ask:

1. Is this **ABSOLUTE** or **EXTREME** wording?

→ *Usually wrong*

2. Is UPSC asking **FACT** or **APPLICATION**?

→ If application → eliminate fact-only options

3. Can I **eliminate 2 options confidently**?

→ If yes → attempt

→ If no → skip

4. Is this a **statement question**?

- Check:

- Universal words (all/only/always)
- Time mismatch
- Authority mismatch

5. Mapping Question?

- Check:

- Direction logic
- Relative position
- Region familiarity

6. Am I guessing emotionally?

→ **STOP**

Attempt philosophy

Accuracy > Attempts

85–90 correct beats 100 attempts
